SUMMARY

During May, total employment:

- fell 0.4% in South Australia in <u>seasonally</u> <u>adjusted</u> terms (nationally, total employment rose 0.3%); and
- fell 0.1% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, total employment rose 0.3%).

During May, the <u>unemployment rate</u>:

- was 4.0% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (4.0% nationally); and
- was 3.9% in South Australia in **trend** terms (4.0% nationally).

FURTHER ANALYSIS

EMPLOYMENT

In **seasonally adjusted** terms in May:


- Total employment in South Australia fell by 3,400 (0.4%), following no change in April—see Chart 1. Full-time employment fell by 4,700 while part-time employment rose by 1,300.
- Nationally, total employment rose by 39,700 (0.3%). Full-time employment rose by 41,700 (0.4%) and part-time employment fell by 2,100.

<u>Through the year</u> seasonally adjusted employment fell by 1.5% for South Australia and rose by 2.5% nationally.


In **trend** terms in May:

- Total employment in South Australia fell by 700 (0.1%). Full-time employment fell by 1,900 while part-time employment rose by 1,200.
- Nationally, total employment rose by 38,700 (0.3%). Full-time employment rose by 26,200 and part-time employment rose by 12,500.

Through the year trend employment fell by 0.7% for South Australia but rose by 2.7% nationally.



In the year to May, the number of employed 15 to 24 year olds in South Australia was 0.3% lower than a year earlier but was 2.3% higher nationally (moving annual average terms)—see Chart 2.




UNEMPLOYMENT

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, South Australia's unemployment rate fell from 4.2% in April to 4.0% in May. Australia's unemployment rate fell from 4.1% in April to 4.0% in May.

In **trend** terms, the unemployment rate in South Australia fell from 4.0% in April to 3.9% in May. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose from 3.9% in April to 4.0% in May—see Table 1 and Chart 3.

In South Australia, the **youth** (15-24 year old) unemployment rate was 9.3% in the year to May, down from 9.4% a year earlier but above the 9.1% rate recorded nationally (**annual average terms**).


UNDEREMPLOYMENT

<u>Underemployed</u> workers are those who are employed part-time and who want, and are available for, more hours of work than they currently have.

The **seasonally adjusted** underemployment rate in South Australia was 7.5% in May. As a result the overall labour force <u>underutilisation</u> rate was 11.4% in May, up from 11.1% a year earlier. In May, the national underutilisation rate was 10.7%.

PARTICIPATION

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, the South Australian participation rate fell 0.5 of a percentage point to 62.3% in May. Nationally, the participation rate remained unchanged at 66.8%.



In **trend** terms, the <u>participation rate</u> in South Australia fell from 62.6% in April to 62.4% in May. Nationally, the participation rate remained unchanged from 66.7% in April—see Chart 4.



In **annual average terms**, the age groups that experienced the largest increases in participation in the year to April 2024 were 45-54 year olds (up 3.2pp) and 65-74 year olds (up 1.9pp). The age groups that experienced the largest falls in participation over the same period were 15-24 year olds (down 2.2pp) and 35-44 year olds (down 1.3pp)—see Table 2.



HOURS WORKED

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, monthly hours worked in all jobs fell by 0.3% in South Australia in May to be 3.3% lower than a year earlier—see Chart 5. Nationally, monthly hours worked in all jobs rose by 0.6% through the year to May.
