SUMMARY

During April, total employment:

- Rose slightly (up 400) in South Australia in <u>seasonally adjusted</u> terms (nationally, total employment rose 0.3%); and
- fell 0.1% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, total employment rose 0.2%).

During April, the <u>unemployment rate</u>:

- was 4.2% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (4.1% nationally); and
- was 4.0% in South Australia in **trend** terms (also 4.0% nationally).

FURTHER ANALYSIS

EMPLOYMENT

In **seasonally adjusted** terms in April:


- Total employment in South Australia rose by 400, following a fall of 9,000 (1.0%) in March see Chart 1. Full-time employment fell by 4,500 while part-time employment rose by 4,900.
- Nationally, total employment rose by 38,500 (0.3%). Full-time employment fell by 6,100 and part-time employment rose by 44,600.

<u>Through the year</u> seasonally adjusted employment growth was 0.2% for South Australia and 2.8% nationally.


In **trend** terms in April:

- Total employment in South Australia fell by 600 (0.1%). Full-time employment fell by 2,500 and part-time employment rose by 1,900.
- Nationally, total employment rose by 30,900 (0.2%). Full-time employment rose by 19,600 and part-time employment rose by 11,300.

Through the year trend employment growth was 0.2% for South Australia and 2.5% nationally.



In the year to April, the number of employed 15 to 24 year olds in South Australia was 0.3% higher than a year earlier and 2.6% higher nationally (moving annual average terms)—see Chart 2.




UNEMPLOYMENT

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, South Australia's unemployment rate rose from 3.9% in March to 4.2% in April. Australia's unemployment rate rose from 3.9% in March to 4.1% in April.

In **trend** terms, the unemployment rate in South Australia remained unchanged at 4.0% in April. Nationally, the unemployment rate also remained unchanged at 4.0% in April—see Table 1 and Chart 3.

In South Australia, the **youth** (15-24 year old) unemployment rate was 9.1% in the year to April, down from 9.5% a year earlier but above the 8.9% rate recorded nationally (**annual average terms**).


UNDEREMPLOYMENT

<u>Underemployed</u> workers are those who are employed part-time and who want, and are available for, more hours of work than they currently have.

The **seasonally adjusted** underemployment rate in South Australia was 7.3% in April. As a result the overall labour force <u>underutilisation</u> rate was 11.5% in April, down from 11.9% a year earlier. In April, the national underutilisation rate was 10.7%.

PARTICIPATION

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, the South Australian participation rate rose 0.1 of a percentage point to 62.8% in April. Nationally, the participation rate rose 0.1 of a percentage point to 66.7%.



In **trend** terms, the <u>participation rate</u> in South Australia fell from 62.9% in March to 62.7% in April. Nationally, the participation rate remained unchanged at 66.7% in April—see Chart 4.



In **annual average terms**, the age groups that experienced the largest increases in participation in the year to March 2024 were 45-54 year olds (up 3.1pp) and 65-74 year olds (up 2.4pp). The age groups that experienced the lowest growth in participation over the same period were 15-24 year olds (down 2.1pp) and 35-44 year olds (down 0.8pp)—see Table 2.



HOURS WORKED

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, monthly hours worked in all jobs fell by 0.8% in South Australia in April and were 5.0% lower than a year earlier—see Chart 5. Nationally, monthly hours worked in all jobs fell by 0.8% through the year to April.
