SUMMARY

During the month of March 2024, retail turnover in nominal (current) prices:

 fell by 0.4% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (also fell by 0.4% nationally).

In addition to the monthly release of nominal retail turnover data, the ABS has this month also released chain volume retail turnover data for the March quarter 2024. Chain volume ('real') data removes the effect of price movements, and therefore provides a measure of the volume of retail trade.

During the March quarter 2024, <u>real</u> retail turnover:

• fell by 0.1% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (fell by 0.4% nationally).

Note: Trend figures are unavailable for the period from March 2020 to June 2022; this brief focuses on seasonally adjusted data where a complete time series is available for comparison.

FURTHER ANALYSIS

Nominal retail turnover (monthly)

During March 2024, seasonally adjusted nominal retail turnover in South Australia fell 0.4%, following a rise of 0.1% in the previous month. Nominal retail turnover also fell 0.4% nationally during March.

Compared to a year earlier, retail turnover was 1.3% higher in South Australia and 0.8% higher nationally.

The Northern Territory recorded the strongest rise in the month (up 0.9%), followed by Western Australia (up 0.6%), Queensland (up 0.4%), and the Australian Capital Territory (up 0.3%), while retail turnover fell in Tasmania (down 0.2%), South Australia (down 0.4%), Victoria (down 0.8%), and New South Wales (down 1.1%) — see Table 1.

CHART 1: MONTHLY NOMINAL RETAIL TURNOVER -






Through the year to March 2024, increases in South Australian retail turnover were recorded for household goods retailing (up 3.4%), food retailing (up 2.3%), department stores retailing (up 2.0%), and 'other' retailing* (up 1.4%). Turnover in the year to March declined for cafes, restaurants and take-away food services (down 0.2%), and clothing, footwear and personal accessory retailing (down 7.9%) — see Chart 2.

*'Other' retailing includes: pharmacy and cosmetics, newspapers and books, stationery, flowers, toys and games, sport and camping equipment and entertainment media retailing.

Real retail turnover (quarterly)

The 0.1% fall in South Australian seasonally adjusted real retail turnover in the March quarter followed a rise of 0.8% in the previous quarter. Nationally, real retail turnover fell by 0.4% in the quarter.

Compared with a year earlier, seasonally adjusted real retail turnover was 0.6% lower in South Australia and 1.3% lower nationally — see Chart 3 and Table 2.

CHART 3: QUARTERLY REAL RETAIL TURNOVER -


